HANDY RATES INFORMATION

If you hold a current Pensioner Concession Card or Department of Veterans Affairs Card issued by the Commonwealth Government, you can apply for a rates rebate.

Council also has a Hardship Policy in place to provide an avenue for relief to those ratepayers who are experiencing genuine financial difficulties in paying their rates and charges. Arrangements can be made with Council to help make your payments more manageable.

PROJECT UPDATE – SVC POOL UPGRADES

Tumut youngsters will be excited to hear that the new splash play zone and learn-to-swim pool will be opening next week.

The splash play zone features a giant water dumping Sea Silhouette Turtle, a gentler water spurting Frog and a swirling floating Bobble.

Upgrade works at the Batlow Pool are in the final stages. The learn-to-swim pool and splash zone is finished, and the plant room fit out is nearing completion.

The new shade structure has been constructed and solar panels will be installed on the structure’s roof to help regulate water temperatures.

A disabled access ramp into the 25m lap pool has been installed and the pool is almost ready to be filled with water.


The new amenities buildings have been installed at Batlow and Khancoban and we are working hard to commission the buildings to open both pools before Christmas. Keep an eye on our socials for opening dates.

Stage 2 of the Khancoban project will take place after the swimming season and will see the old amenities building demolished and replaced with a new shade structure. Solar panels will be installed on the structure’s roof to help regulate water temperatures.

YAVEN CREEK ROAD PROJECT

The \$900,000 funded Yaven Creek Road upgrade project is complete.

The project included culvert replacement, road realignment, road widening and pavement reconstruction of 1.58km section of road at the area adjacent to the Snowy Mountains Highway.

The project came in under budget and the remaining funds will be used for heavy patching failed sections along Yaven Creek Road over the next few months.
