Too many ecologically damaging introduced species are permitted, encouraged, or deliberately planted, to dominate roadside environments. Many introduced species possess characteristics which not only dominate roadsides denying habitat for native species, threatened or otherwise, but also detrimentally impact air, water, and land quality. To presume to protect and revitalise roadside environments without preventing ongoing propagation and/or infestation by introduced species, acts contrary to claimed intentions to "protect local fauna and biodiversity ecosystems". Roadside project or maintenance work which promotes, protects or maintains, invasive or otherwise detrimental introduced vegetation species, is fundamentally in breach of the principles of this policy, and the policy should expressly recognise this to be so.
