

The Snowy 2.0 project will have profound implications for the Snowy Mountains region.

- Snowy Valleys and Snowy Monaro Regional Councils are committed to working in partnership with the NSW Government to build for the future utilising the Snowy Hydro Legacy Fund.
- Quarantine \$600M of the \$4.2 billion Snowy Hydro Legacy Fund to establish a Future Fund.
- Include an enduring contribution of a dollar per megawatt of energy sold to the Fund to grow the principle over time.




