1. Regional issues

- · Need for regional learning options
- **Regional Australian Institute** presentation focussed on regional no longer means only rural jobs. 1 in 5 in metro areas thinking about regional move choice based on family and liveability.
- RAI has a Liveability Toolkit movetomore.com.au
- Has **supporter packs** for councils can tap into campaign to launch our region
- Regional data hubs established Regional Data Australia there is funding to establish one of these
- Regional connectivity hubs set up to assist regional areas get connected mobile black spot program

2. Health

National Rural Health Alliance – Dr Flynn scholarships– assists doctors to come to regions

 ${\sf RACCHO-Rural\ Area\ Community\ Controlled\ Health\ Organisation-is\ a\ place-based\ model\ of\ care}$

Barriers for doctors coming to rural areas – 60% not interested in becoming a business – need to change current model

Only 2% solo practices in rural areas

LG involvement with RACCHO -

- Facilitate community consultation
- Infrastructure
- Coordinate RACCHO

We need to stop going on about health shortages because the negative image could make situation worse

Suicide – re-framing – better way to think of in terms of community wellbeing rather than have suicide prevention committee

Intentional self harm can be precursor to suicide

Activities to support community wellbeing

- · Mental health training
- Involvement of schools
- Specialists + support services
- · Pop up hubs in main streets

Our Health Clarence – one community's response to suicide – had community + health experts to get together to look at making a plan about preventing suicide and / or after the event

Banksia Project in Orange

COVID -need 80% vaccinated to protect everyone

10% hard core anti vaccers – others need good media campaign to nudge them to get vaccinated

Head Yakka - mental health program initiative - headyakka.org.au

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3. LG specific issues

Infrastructure Australia – has "**Pipeline**" – their plan for priority projects – they welcome submissions – can sign up to their newsletter for further information

4. Climate change

Agriculture and environment will become enmeshed Will lead to more pandemics

National Climate Policies and Positions - COP – leaders come together globally to talk about what they are doing – COP in Glascow this year – overarching focus = need to focus on reducing temperature rise to less than 1.2 degrees.

UK Plan – has developed plans to highlight needs to reduce emissions through

- Nature based solutions
- Transport
- Adaptation sharing experiences
- Water security

Focus now on mitigation as well as adaptation

Australian Climate Service – brings together peak agencies – provides detailed modelling on impacts and cost of those impacts

GCoM – Global Covenant of Mayors for climate and energy = international alliance of cities working together to achieve climate resilience - paper written – "State of Play" about LG and city networks accelerating climate action in Australia

Emissions reduction could be delivered faster if there was a national program to help LG

5. Recovery and resilience

Current fiscal strategy – will not be pulled back until unemployment below 4% **Shane Fitzsimmons** defines **resilience as** "learning through lived experiences to understand what we are vulnerable to so that we can recover effectively. It is about healing. **Recovery** = need to reframe and talk about rebuilding – repair and reconstruction

6 areas across NSW to be established to work with local communities **National Recovery and Resilience Agency –** is a permanent agency to start 1sty July –

Resilience Hubs to be established.

6. Waste

National Waste Policy – need long term transition for carbon workers – pivot to green opportunities eg green steel

7. Security

Cyber security – greatest current threat is ransomware. Currently health sector being targeted – but hospitality, government and energy all at risk LG residents need to be reassured that their data is safe – smart meters, DA records, rating and billing – CyberArk – has created 8 podcasts to teach about cybersecurity.

Built 2 units for seniors

Then made payments to doctors, provided housing, paid for doctors< exams.

2 surgeries built I combined surgeries cost \$2.5m. Went from 6 doctors to 12.

Also purchased old aged care building near hospital converted to aboriginal medical centre with units to accommodate students and doctors.

Partnership with Wollongong Uni..

Then saved Govt. \$25m

Now can't get help from Govt for new Surgery

VMO versus Locums issues

Solution: 2 year rolling program visiting rotational city qualified-doctors. Facilitated through NSW Health. In return cancel or reduce HECS debts. After 2 years they might want to stay

Sam Telfer LGA SA

Different dynamics. Small communities 1 - 3k people. Looking for GP's RN"s Allied Health people. Issues with different levels of Government. 11 LGA"s, 2 city 9 country. 50%. Dr's past retiring age. Sustainable GP training needed urgently. Exorbitant cost of locums. "Not our responsibility" no longer true. Councils need to take initiative. Doctors are not business people. Succession planning important. Professional support required.
