What is the NSW Government doing?

- Creating a new seventh network, Destination Central West NSW
- Changing some Destination Network boundaries to better align with existing NSW Government regional structures.

Why the changes?

 To ensure regional NSW has the optimal destination management framework to best support visitor growth, job creation, skills development and stakeholder engagement.

When will the changes take effect?

• From 1 July 2022.

How will the Destination Networks operate until that time?

 All current Destination Network Board positions have been extended to 30 June 2022 to enable continuity in governance.

Next steps

- Establish Destination Central West NSW to be operational from 1 July 2022
- Refresh all current Destination Network Boards and recruit for Destination Central West NSW recruitment process commencing late January 2022.

Destination North Coast	No change
Destination Riverina Murray	Remove Snowy Valleys LGA
Destination Southern NSW	Relocate Snowy Valleys LGA to Destination Southern NSW
Destination Sydney Surrounds North	Remove Penrith, Hawkesbury and Blue Mountains to facilitate better alignment with the Western Parkland City
Destination Sydney Surrounds South	Remove Wollondilly LGA to facilitate better alignment with the Western Parkland City
