

# DESTINATION NETWORK CHANGES

## What is the NSW Government doing?

- Creating a new seventh network, Destination Central West NSW
- Changing some Destination Network boundaries to better align with existing NSW Government regional structures.

## Why the changes?

- To ensure regional NSW has the optimal destination management framework to best support visitor growth, job creation, skills development and stakeholder engagement.

## When will the changes take effect?

- From 1 July 2022.

## How will the Destination Networks operate until that time?

- All current Destination Network Board positions have been extended to 30 June 2022 to enable continuity in governance.

## Next steps

- Establish Destination Central West NSW to be operational from 1 July 2022
  - Refresh all current Destination Network Boards and recruit for Destination Central West NSW – recruitment process commencing late January 2022.

# DESTINATION NETWORK BOUNDARY CHANGES

Destination Network	Key Changes
<b>Destination Country &amp; Outback NSW</b>	Remove the LGAs of Mid-Western Regional, Lithgow, Oberon, Bathurst Regional, Blayney, Orange, Cowra, Weddin and Cabonne
<b>Destination Central West NSW</b>	New Destination Network to support the LGAs removed from Destination Country & Outback NSW
<b>Destination North Coast</b>	No change
<b>Destination Riverina Murray</b>	Remove Snowy Valleys LGA
<b>Destination Southern NSW</b>	Relocate Snowy Valleys LGA to Destination Southern NSW
<b>Destination Sydney Surrounds North</b>	Remove Penrith, Hawkesbury and Blue Mountains to facilitate better alignment with the Western Parkland City
<b>Destination Sydney Surrounds South</b>	Remove Wollondilly LGA to facilitate better alignment with the Western Parkland City
