GENERAL MANAGER MEETS WITH NSW RFS DEPUTY COMMISSIONER

The work to finalise the way forward for the construction of a Fire Control Centre at the Tumut Aerodrome continues, with Council and NSW Rural Fire Service representatives meeting again last week.

NSW RFS Deputy Commissioner Kyle Stewart met with our General Manager Ken Gouldthorp onsite at the Tumut Aerodrome to review the Draft Master Plan prior to its consideration at the February Council meeting.

The Draft Master Plan includes space allocation for an improved RFS facility incorporating a Fire Control Centre, operations centre, administration area, training facilities and a hangar.



MORE BRINDABELLA ROAD FUNDING ANNOUNCED

An additional \$20M in funding for Brindabella Road was announced recently by the Hon. Catherine King MP, Federal Minister for Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development and Local Government and the Hon. Kristy McBain MP, Minister for Regional Development, Local Government and Territories.

Council welcomed the funding announcement and will now work through the prioritisation of the next stage of road works, as the associated funding agreement is finalised with the Department.

The previously announced \$17.4M for Brindabella Road is for the upgrade, reconstruction and re-alignment of the road between Piccadilly Circus and the Brindabella Valley to address safety concerns with the existing road, improve liveability for residents, improve business productivity and enable an uplift in tourism visitation.

DEMERGER BUSINESS CASE

The development of the independent report on the advantages and disadvantages of demerging Snowy Valleys Council has commenced with the first steps in engaging with the community underway.

Report author and project lead, Professor Joseph Drew of the University of Newcastle, will meet with representatives of key stakeholder groups, Councillors, and Council staff to collect information, feedback, and individual views on the advantages and disadvantages of demerging.

Additional community-wide meetings will then be held in April.

Following the initial meetings with key stakeholders, the Professor will return to present his draft report at two community meetings which will be open for all those interested.
