WORKS COMMENCE – TUMUT ROTARY PIONEER PARK UPGRADE



Work has started on the Rotary Pioneer Park upgrades. Preliminary works will focus on improving green infrastructure around the pondage section of the park.

Security fencing has been installed around the work zone while we work to safely complete construction.

The walking path from the river past the labyrinth to the playground will be closed for a short time and we encourage users to use the alternate path closer to the pool.

The project includes new amenities, to be located near the pool carpark, nature play facilities catering for younger children, improved pathways, new bridges, low maintenance plantings and more seating and picnic tables.

Council received \$1,330,000 from the NSW Government's Public Spaces Legacy Program for the project.

SEWER VENT SHAFT REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

Council is removing and replacing aging concrete ventilation

shafts as a safety priority.

Sewer vent shafts play a crucial role in wastewater networks by providing adequate ventilation, like an exhaust fan in your bathroom.

Council maintains and operates 46 vent shafts in Tumut. These are located primarily in the old section of town to ensure the network in this area is ventilated properly.



Many of the old concrete shafts are over 80 years old. When exposed to sewer gases concrete degrades making the vent shafts more susceptible to damage, lightning strikes and/or collapse, posing a danger to people and property.

Concrete vent shafts are being replaced with sustainable highperformance stainless steel for better durability and low maintenance.

Vent shafts need to be a specific height to maximise airflow and minimise the risk of odour from the wastewater network. The ones in Tumut are nine metres tall, and if you've never noticed them you might now!

To date, 27 shafts have been replaced in Tumut.

TENDERS CALLED FOR MULTIPURPOSE CENTRE

Tender applications are now being sought for the design and construction of the Tumut Multipurpose Center.

Over the past six months, Council worked with a designer and a community working group to develop a concept design to help guide tenderers.



The tender concept design includes a sports hall comprising two basketball-sized courts with spectator seating, multiple small rooms and offices, a kitchen and amenities/change rooms.

The final detailed design for the facility is subject to alteration as Council considers tender bids.

The Request for Tender closes on Friday 5 May 2023. Tender lodgement is online via the Tenderlink website.

LINE MARKING ROAD WORKS

Over the next few weeks, we'll be undertaking a vast line marking program across the region to complete works on roads that have recently been repaired or resealed.

Line marking refers to painted lines and symbols, as well as raised reflective pavement markers which are also known as cats eyes.

Each year, Council undertakes a blitz of works to maintain and service the more than 700 kilometres of sealed local roads we manage across the Snowy Valleys.

Caring for our roads is one of our most important tasks and our teams proactively maintain our road network to increase safety and quality.

If you are driving near any of these works, please remember to slow down and take care especially around line marking machinery.
