There are a number of things happening around the Snowy Valleys area with the advent of Spring. The school holiday season is bringing a large number of visitors to the area to enjoy what most of us can take for granted living in this part of the world.

A couple of particularly important projects underway at the moment are the Floodplain Risk Management Plans for both the Tumut and Tumbarumba townships.

The studies required for the development of the management plans will involve collection of data, consultation with community and relevant government agencies as well as flood modelling.

Tumut Flood Study

The process is funded and overseen by the Department of Planning and Environment with the technical aspects being undertaken by WMA Water who are a leading firm specialising in flood planning matters.

The first round of consultations for the Tumut study was held on Tuesday 26 September, however, if anyone was not able to attend that session and wishes to have some input, they can complete an online survey on Council's website. The consultants would be very interested in gaining all first-hand local knowledge of flood impacts and behaviours and photographs of flood events may also be very helpful.

Consultations in the Tumbarumba area will be held in the near future and again all local input, anecdotal or photographic would be appreciated.

The flood studies will inform future land uses in the areas with regard to both private and public infrastructure development with a view to minimising the impacts and cost burdens of flooding. Further information can be viewed at www.svc.nsw.gov.au/tumut-flood-study.
