COUNCILLOR COLUMN - MAYOR IAN CHAFFEY

As 2023 draws to an end Council has decided to proceed with a preferred option for the expansion of the Tumut airstrip. The agreed option is achievable with the funds provided and will improve the firefighting capacity of the Rural Fire Service whilst also making provision for potential further development when and if further funds become available.

In light of additional funding being made available a decision has also been made to proceed with the construction of the Tumut Multi Purpose Centre and to establish a Liaison Committee to consider how the facility will be managed in the future. The construction will need to be well managed to ensure the maximum benefit flow from the funds provided.

I believe the new year will require Council to make some hard decisions, particularly around the demerger issue and a Special Rate Variation submission to IPART. Council's financial position is still cause for concern and work is still needed to reign in costs and get better value for our dollar in what is a very challenging time.

Your Council has been active in assisting with the development of a funding application for the establishment of a Country University Centre in the old Tumut Council Offices. The commitment of those involved to bring this application about has been amazing, it shows what people with passion can achieve in a short period. The CUC will have its own Board separate from council to operate the facility if the application is successful.

At the final meeting for the year, council voted to proceed with an application for the funding of the Batlow to Wybalena Cider Trail. If successful, this will be a significant development in the tourism experience in Batlow and the wider Snowy Valleys community.

I would like to take the opportunity to welcome into the Snowy Valleys community eight new Australians who took the Pledge on the 14th of December It is a great honour to be part of that ceremony. Congratulations.

As we come to that part of the year where good tidings should prevail, we as a nation have much to be thankful for, if we can in any way give someone a hand up let us do so.

I would like to thank the people of SVC who have contributed so much to advancing our community over the last year, it is personally and on behalf of Council much appreciated.
