TUMBATREK 2024

This year's Tumbatrek took walkers on an epic 13km trek through the Bago State Forest along the Hume and Hovell Track.

Around 150 people joined the walk this year including Member for Eden Manaro Kristy McBain who led the trek, as well as Justin Clancy MP, the Hon Michael McCormack and the Hon Jenny Aichinson MP.



YAVEN CREEK ROAD WORKS

A stretch of Yaven Creek Road, at the Snowy Mountains Highway end, has recently been improved.



The next focus will be an approx 4km section at the Southern end, expected to be finished by May 2024.

Works include road reconstruction efforts to address surface wear and pavement issues.

These safety enhancement efforts will improve the road conditions and ensure its ongoing suitability for agricultural and forestry use.

The Yaven Creek Road improvement project is funded by the NSW Government's Fixing Local Roads Fund.
