
#### PARK UPGRADES CELEBRATED

#### YOUTH WEEK ACTIVITIES

In celebration of NSW Youth Week, we are hosting a couple of great, free initiatives to engage our young people.

## WEED CONTROL WORKS

Over the next 6 months, we will be undertaking weed control works in our parks, sporting ovals and cemeteries. The herbicides we use are Gauntlet, Duke, Fairway, Tribute, BarricadAcelepryn, Numchuk Quad, Amigo, Rumbler and Octane. Treatment areas will be signposted.



## **BULLPADDOCK CHANGEROOMS**

Construction of the brand new female changerooms at Tumut's Bull Paddock is underway.

Located on the Broughton Street side of the existing amenities, the new changerooms will cater to visitors and home club users.

The facility will be equipped with a toilet, showers, bench seating areas, a referee room, storage space, and a verandah.

This grant funded upgrade will transform one of our region's busiest recreation hubs and provide a safe and comfortable space for female athletes to prepare and unwind before and after competitions.
