FOGO TRAINING

Our FOGO team have been training in the operation of the Modular Aerated Floor (MAF) Composting technology at our Gilmore composting facility (see below).

The MAF system uses innovative composting technology, a series of pipes installed underneath the compost piles aerates the compost and speeds up the process.

The technology will turn food and garden waste into rich compost for our sporting fields and cemeteries.

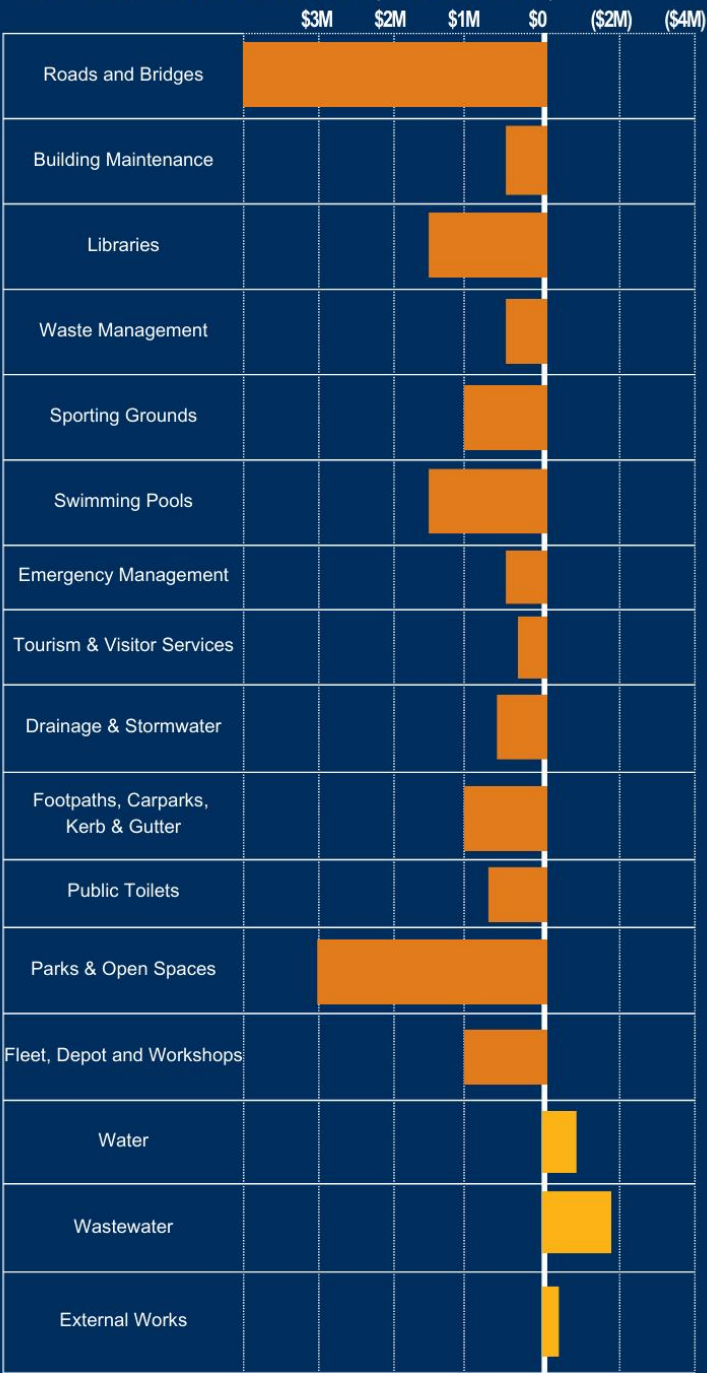
