CULVERT REPLACEMENTS

Culvert replacement projects are now underway on Indi North Road and Munderoo Ournie Road (over Johanna Creek).

Traffic control measures are in place during the construction, and motorists should expect short delays. Work is scheduled for completion by mid-June.

These roads were impacted by the 2022/23 floods and the replacement works are jointly funded by the Commonwealth and NSW governments under the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements.




COUNCILLOR COLUMN - CR JULIA HAM

FEMALE CHANGE FACILITIES

We are building new female change facilities at the Bull Paddock in Tumut.

Construction got underway in February 2024 and the groundwork, including foundation, slab, and block construction, has been finished, and roofing is well underway.

The internal fit-out is scheduled to commence shortly, keeping us on track to open the facility for use in early Spring.

The new facility will comprise both visitor and home change rooms equipped with showers, toilets, and bench seating areas, along with a referee room, storage space, and verandah.

Grant funding towards the project is from Stronger Country Communities Fund R4 (SCCF4) and The Office of Sport Female Friendly Community Sport Facilities and Lighting Upgrades Grant Program.



SNOWY VALLEYS SCULPTURE TRAIL

The Snowy Valleys Sculpture Trail is a permanent collection of sculptures winding from Adelong to Tooma. The newly unveiled Sculpture Forest in the Bago State Forest is the most recent addition to the Trail.
