The evening finished with some awards to individuals who excelled in the year previous in their service to Rotary and the community.

ANNUAL PLANS ADOPTED

Our 2024/25 Operational Plan, Operating Budget and Fees & Charges have been adopted.

The Operational Plan has 169 actions and a \$41.6 million Capital Works program with over \$5.7 million allocated to local roads and bridges.



Rates will increase by 5% in 2024/25, the maximum allowed by IPART, and Hall hiring fees have been reduced, providing more flexibility for commercial and community groups.

NAIDOC WEEK EVENTS IN THE SNOWY VALLEYS

Snowy Valleys Council will join with Elders from the Brungle Tumut Local Aboriginal Land Council (BTLALC) and the Ngarigo Toomaroombah Kunama Namadgi Indigenous Corporation (NTKNIC) in marking NAIDOC week 2024 at flag-raising ceremonies in Tumut and Tumbarumba.

Tumut - Tues 9 July at 10am

Flag Raising, Welcome to Country and NAIDOC Address outside Council Offices followed by Smoking Ceremony and Morning Tea at Riverside Café

Tumbarumba – Wed 10 July at 10am

Flag Raising, Welcome to Country, NAIDOC Address and Smoking Ceremony outside Council Offices, followed by Yarn and Brunch and children's activities at Tumbarumba RSL Hall

A range of other activities are also being held throughout the week including a bush tucker walk, artefacts talk and free art workshops.

NAIDOC Week is a national celebration that occurs in July each year. This year's theme is Keep the Fire Burning! Blak, Loud & Proud.

The theme honours the enduring strength and vitality of First Nations culture – with fire a symbol of connection to Country, to each other, and to the rich tapestry of traditions that define Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

LIVESTOCK ON ROADS

A reminder for stock owners to check fencing and ensure that livestock is contained on your property to aid in community safety.

Council has had a spike in livestock on-road complaints recently with several after-hour and weekend call-outs.

If you are an owner of livestock, you have a responsibility to ensure your stock do not stray onto public roads.

If your livestock stray and contribute to a motor vehicle accident, you may be charged with a criminal offence.
