FLOOD RECOVERY WORKS

More flood recovery works from the 2022/23 flood event have recently been completed around the region.

Projects include:

- Munderoo Ournie Road - culvert remediation work
- Alpine Way – drain cleanup and culvert unblocking
- Maragle Road - pipe culvert works
- Waterfall Farm Road - culvert upgrade
- Yaven Creek Road - amco arch culvert upgrade
- Jingellic River Road Footbridge (pictured below) – structural repairs and approach works, scheduled to reopen soon.

These projects were jointly funded by the Commonwealth and NSW governments under the Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements.

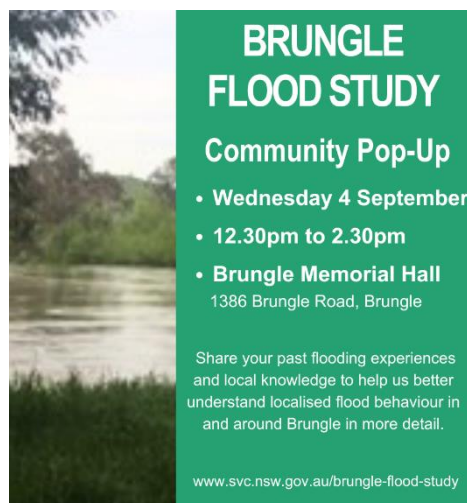

The Study aims to reduce the impacts of flooding and flood liability and support a range of functions like development, planning, community education and mitigation works.

NEW OPERATING HOURS FOR RESOURCE RECOVERY CENTRES

From September Resource Recovery Centres (RRCs) at Adelong, Batlow, Khancoban and Talbingo will now open two days a week.

These changes are part of an approved series of service reductions aimed at ensuring financial sustainability over the coming 12 months.

The Tumbarumba centre will continue to open four days a week and the Tumut RRC will operate five days a week.

Residents can visit any RRC to drop off recycling and waste and Community Recycling Centres (CRC) within the Tumbarumba and Tumut Centres also provide permanent free drop-off for common household problem waste including chemicals, e-waste, batteries, household paint and cooking oil.

The container deposit scheme Retun & Earn and the Re-use Shop also operate within the Tumut RRC.

LIVESTOCK ON ROADS

Following a significant increase in unattended livestock in public areas, roads, and public lands, stock owners are urged to take proactive measures to secure their animals and prevent future incidents.

There have also been increasing cases of sheep, cattle, and horses on rural roads posing threats to unsuspecting motorists.

A number of the calls received relate to stock out on regional and state roads where vehicle speeds are higher and could translate into serious injury or a fatality.

Livestock owners can be liable for any damage or injury caused by a traffic accident where livestock are found wandering on public roads.

Landowners are urged to regularly check their fences for damage, especially after wild weather, and make any repairs as soon as practicable.
