On Saturday, 26 October, from 5pm to 10pm, Elm Drive Tumut will come alive with interactive light displays,



live performances, creative installations, cultural activities, and a variety of local food and beverage options.

Festival Highlights Include:

- Crazy Big Theremin: Step into a mesmerising sea of light, smoke, and sound with this interactive installation.
- Snowy Valleys Sculpture Trail Art Installation: Join sculpture artist Robyn Veneer-Sweeney and local students as they bring creative visions to life using mostly recycled and repurposed materials.
- Giant Interactive Lanterns: Discover stunning custom animal lanterns blending traditional lantern design, sculpture, and illustration.
- Lantern-Making Workshops:
 Children and families can craft their own lanterns to hang from nearby trees, lighting up the night with joy and colour.

NEW PUBLIC EV CHARGING STATIONS SET TO BOOST TOURISM

Snowy Valleys is getting ten new public EV charging stations making the Snowy Valleys a welcoming destination for electric vehicle owners.

Thanks to a partnership between Council and Snowy Hydro, these chargers will soon be up and running in Adelong, Khancoban, Talbingo, Tumbarumba, and Tumut.

Each location will have two 22kW dual-port chargers with dedicated parking spots, making it easier for EV drivers to recharge while exploring local shops and attractions.

The new charging infrastructure will be installed on Council managed land in Tumut – RHB Carpark, Adelong – Golden Gully Park, Talbingo – Shopping Centre Carpark, Tumbarumba – Union Lane Carpark, and Khancoban – Shopping Centre Carpark. Works are scheduled to start soon.

SAFETY BARRIER WORKS

We have been upgrading the end terminals and raising the height of the guardrail in places on Broadleaf Park Road between Rosewood and the Taradale Road intersection.
