## ADELONG MAIN STREET DESIGN PROJECT

Council has secured funding through the NSW Severe Weather and Flood Grant from the NSW Office of Local Government to develop a masterplan for Adelong's main street.

The masterplan project primarily aims to develop enhanced drainage designs to assist during rain events (excluding major creek flooding) and improve overall safety and usability.

Combining landscape architecture and engineering designs, once completed the Masterplan will enable Council to make future applications for grant funding to undertake construction works.

Council is also consulting with Transport for NSW, the road asset owner, to help shape a clear design brief.
