

TUMBA CREEK FOOTPATH

The Tumbarumba Creek Footpath upgrade is now complete. The project replaced the existing granite footpath with a concrete path, starting at Cape Street and extending 320 meters downstream.

Drainage was improved with new culverts, and remediation and enhancement work were carried out near the bridges at both ends of the site.





MAJOR UPGRADES UNDERWAY AT TUMUT AERODROME

Construction at Tumut Aerodrome is well underway, boosting its capacity for firefighting and aeromedical services.

Work began in January 2025 with site preparations, including services relocation and access setup. Key upgrades include:

- Land negotiations for the southern parallel taxiway, crucial for firefighting operations
- New RFS Hardstand for improved readiness
- Runway widening and pavement reconstruction for better aircraft maneuverability
- Upgrades to the General Aviation Apron and taxiways

Funded by \$12.5M from the NSW and Commonwealth Governments (BLERF), the project is on track for completion later this year, ensuring long-term benefits for emergency response and aviation.



TOOMA HALL UPGRADE

Tooma Hall is enjoying a major upgrade thanks to the hard work of the Tooma Recreation Reserve Committee, a \$1.2M grant from the Black Summer Bushfire Recovery Fund, and support from Council.

We've reviewed our Community Strategic Plan (CSP) to ensure it aligns with community priorities.


From 1 Feb – 15 Mar 2024, 458 residents shared their thoughts on:
