PLAYGROUND UPGRADE COMING SOON TO BATLOW MEMORIAL PARK

Work is starting later this month to upgrade the Memorial Park playground and surrounding area.

We're expanding the play space and adding a brand-new spinning Rotanet for even more fun. The entire area will get fresh soft-fall surfacing, new edging and brand new shelters with table settings — perfect for family picnics and catch-ups at the park.

The project is funded by a grant from the NSW Government's Local Small Commitments Allocation (LSCA) Program and a contribution from Council's capital budget.




OUT FOR ADVENTURE CAMPAIGN
