# OUTSIDE WORKS: AUTUMN EDITION

Our outdoor teams have been working hard across the region, tackling everything from seasonal clean-ups to safety upgrades.

Here's a snapshot of what they've been up to:

- Sweeping up autumn With leaves falling fast, street sweeping has stepped up a notch to keep our roads and gutters clear.
- Roadside cleanup The excavator mulcher has been out on the roadsides, helping to keep vegetation under control (photo below work on Tooma Road).
- Trimming for safety Roadside trees are getting a tidy-up to improve visibility and keep our roads safe.
- Signage spruce-up Street blades and guideposts are being replaced where needed to keep signage clear and up to date.
- Grazing permits in progress We've been working with Local Land Services to issue roadside grazing permits.
- Fixing footpaths Repairs were recently completed on Capper Street near Forest Street in Tumut.
- Riverwalk safety Sandstone bollards have been installed across from Tumut's Riverside Café to improve parking and pedestrian safety.



# FOGO WITHOUT THE STICKERS
