#### MEC GETS THE GREEN LIGHT

Snowy Valleys Council has welcomed the decision by the Southern Region Planning Panel to grant approval for the Multipurpose and Evacuation Centre.

The decision follows a public meeting in June and the submission of further information by Council.

With consent now in place, Council will release the construction tender, with plans to appoint a contractor at the August Council Meeting and begin construction in spring.

Early works, including relocating the Richmond Park playground towards Capper Street, will start in the coming weeks.

Council appreciates the community feedback received throughout the planning process and acknowledges the valuable input of the local working group.
