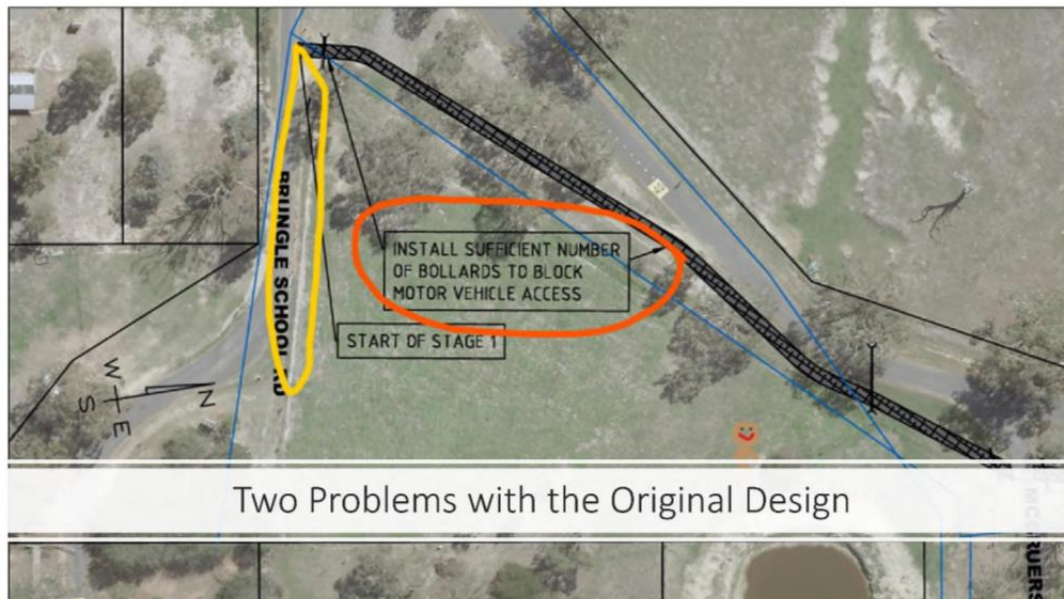


## BRUNGLE PEDESTRIAN FACILITY CONSTRUCTION PLAN

## Council or Department of Education or Tumut Brungle Lands Council or Current Landowner

At present we have the area under tenure (Licence 616069) for grazing.

IF Council wants to place a footpath through that part of the McGruers Street that is still Crown Road, you are asked to request the transfer of it to Council. Once transferred we would terminate the tenure.

It is noted the last inspection carried out of this area, some 12 months ago noted the area was fenced, and you are saying the kids are climbing over or through, two fences, as a short cut?

It should be noted that the "School road" that is located adjoining Lot 208 DP 750976 and then NE of Lot 1 DP 1002709, ending on the western boundary of Lot 1 Sec 22 DP 758169 (School) is also Crown Public road, so maybe Council should also request that this area of road also be transferred.
