Transgrid HumeLink Project Overview

HumeLink is a new 500kV transmission line which will connect Wagga Wagga, Bannaby and Maragle.

The HumeLink project will be delivered by two joint venture partners with strong experience in infrastructure projects in regional NSW. The two joint ventures will each deliver a section of the route:

- HumeLink East: Acciona and GenusPlus Group Ltd (JV); and
- HumeLink West: UGL and CPB Contractors (JV).

The Snowy Valleys Local Government Area (LGA) is the interface (junction) point for the HumeLink West and HumeLink East transmission lines and has interactions with both East and West sections.

Batlow Resides in the 'West' component of the project.

Council has no statutory authority in this process as the project is classified as State Significant Infrastructure. The HumeLink project is a controlled action under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* and will be assessed under the bilateral agreement between the NSW and Commonwealth Governments.





Transgrid HumeLink Project Update

NSW State Approval was received on the 14 November 2024 and the project is currently awaiting Commonwealth Approval.

At this stage, HumeLink has been undertaking early works including detailed design, survey & investigations, and procurement.

The 'Enabling Works' are to commence after all project approvals and the final investment decision is made, which is expected to occur in December 2024.

Enabling Works will include construction of laydown areas, accommodation facilities and access tracks.




Accommodation Camp Update

Location is on Green Hills Access Road (blue circle) – approx. 10 minute drive (6.5km) west of Batlow township.

Accommodation will be suitable for 350 workers

The accommodation camp will be established during the Enabling Works phase. The access tracks to the site will be built followed by the compound construction.





Works Update

- The Batlow Memorial Avenue Compound will primarily be used for refueling vehicles, washdown and the water supply
 point.
- Council has developed a water supply agreement with HumeLink West and will be monitoring water usage
- Access tracks will be built for each of the tower locations all of the construction S138 applications will be assessed by
 Council
- Emergency Services meeting Council hosted a meeting between HumeLink to discuss the Emergency Management Plans and roles/responsibilities of all agencies
- Communication process Council is working with HumeLink to ensure information will be shared with community regarding project activities
- Council have counters out on roads that will be used by the HumeLink project to help determine the level of impact this will have on our road network.
- Council is currently discussing road condition and maintenance requirements on affected roads with HumeLink partners to ensure that inspections and maintenance is undertaken throughout project delivery and roads are safe for the community
